The Pumpkin

In 1584, after French explorer Jacques Cartier explored the St. Lawrence region of North America, he reported finding "gros melons." The name was translated into English as "pompions," which has since evolved into the modern "pumpkin."

Pumpkins have been grown in North America for five thousand years. They are indigenous to the western hemisphere.

Pumpkins are fruits. A pumpkin is a type of squash and is a member of the gourd family (Cucurbitacae), which include squash, cucumbers, gherkins, and melons.

Pumpkin seeds should be planted between the last week of May and the middle of June. They take between 90 and 120 days to grow and are picked in October when they are bright orange in color. Their seeds can be saved to grow new pumpkins the next year.



The Four Seasons Garden Club

Have you planted your fall garden yet? It is time to plant all the cool season crops such as: broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, all kinds of lettuce, beets, onions, garlic and Swiss chard. Now is also the ideal time to plant most landscape trees, shrubs and bulbs. Just be sure to water them well.

Because of the big Arts & Crafts Fair on October 2, there will be no work party or monthly meeting in October. However, there will be a **field trip to Intermountain Nursery in Prather on October 21**. Anyone who is interested will meet at 9 AM at the Library to carpool. Bring a bag lunch. The tour is scheduled for 10:30 at 30443 Auberry Road in Prather.

In November the regular Garden Club meetings will resume. The Work Party will meet at 8 AM, November 9 and the Monthly meeting will be on the 3rd Thursday (Nov. 18) at 6 PM. The program for November will be about "Pruning".

The Four Seasons Garden Club was founded July 26, 1991 by Maynard Wilson who was the first President.

When the Bear Mountain Library and Activity Center was in the planning stage, Four Seasons Garden Club offered to landscape and maintain the 2 acre area behind the Library and it was designated as the Nature Trail by the County.

Since taking on this responsibility the Garden Club has spent several thousand dollars, has planted hundreds of trees, shrubs, herbs, annuals, etc. The Garden Club has constructed a gazebo, a storage building, memorial structures and benches, picnic tables, an educational platform, specialty gardens, installed trails and identity signs for trees plus many other improvements. All these improvements are paid for by the Garden Club from the two main fundraising events each year. These events are: The Arts & Crafts Fair on the first Saturday in October and the Spring Garden Tour which features four or five local gardens. In addition the volunteers have spent countless hours doing the necessary work to keep the Nature Trail in good condition.

At present there are between 45 and 55 active members of the Garden Club. If anyone in the area has an interest in gardening and would like to meet with people who are willing to share their gardening knowledge, we invite them to come to the meetings on the third Thursday at 6 PM in the Library Community Room. The next meeting will be November 18 at 6 PM.
